annihilate uh • NY • uh • late VERB to destroy completely [A hurricane could annihilate this town.]

berate bee•RATE VERB to scold sharply or harshly [It isn't fair to berate me for an accident that wasn't my fault.]

brink BRINK NOUN the edge of something [A crow was perched on the *brink* of the roof.]

devise di • VIZE VERB to work out or create something by thinking; to invent [Two prisoners worked together to devise an escape plan.]

dormant DOR•munt ADJECTIVE sleeping or as if sleeping; not active [Rosebushes are *dormant* in the winter, but they start to grow again in the spring.]

drone DRONE

VERB 1. to make a steady, low, humming or buzzing sound [Listen to the airplane engine *drone*.]

VERB 2. to speak in a dull, tiresome manner [If a speaker *drones* on, I get really bored.]

NOUN a steady, low humming or buzzing sound [The *drone* of the dishwasher wasn't loud, but it still annoyed me.]

embed em·BED VERB

to set or fix firmly in (something) [It was necessary to *embed* the fence posts in cement so that they wouldn't wobble.]

frenzy FREN•zee NOUN

very great excitement; a wild outburst of
feeling or action [Five ambulances arrived at
once, and the emergency room burst into a frenzy
of noise and activity.]

hurtle HUR•tul VERB to move swiftly and with great force [We watched the train hurtle past.]

improbable im • PROB • uh • bul ADJECTIVE not likely to happen or be true; unlikely [My brother hopes to get a car for his birthday, but I think that's improbable.]

jeopardy JEP•ur•dee NOUN great risk or danger of loss, injury, or death [The troops at the front lines faced the greatest jeopardy.]

lax LAX ADJECTIVE

- 1. not careful or watchful enough; careless [Don't be *lax* about capitalizing proper nouns.]
- 2. allowing too much freedom; not strict [The coach was *lax* about whether we showed up for practice, so our team was pretty bad.]
- **3.** not tense, tight, or firm; loose [A *lax* clothesline will droop.]

undeniable *un•di•NY•uh•bul* ADJECTIVE that cannot be denied; unquestionable; certain [Lily's talent is *undeniable*, but I wonder about her willingness to practice.]

DALMATIAN: You say something burned? Where was the fire? Did you call the fire department? Was anyone in jeopardy?

DACHSHUND: Is it the ceiling light? Because it's highly improbable that I can reach the ceiling light.
